Celebrating Excellence in 2019

It was incredible year at Ross Memorial Hospital as we celebrated many important accomplishments and awards. Our physicians and staff were recognized for their commitment to delivering exceptional patient care, and we added new care, technology and services to better serve patients of the City of Kawartha Lakes. Here are a few highlights from 2019:

- Cancer Care Ontario recognized RMH's Surgical Oncology team as the top provincial performer for cancer surgery wait times, from time of referral to consultation. The team (Dr. McNabb, Dr. Greenberg, Karen Spearing, Chrissy Hudson) has recently expanded to add a new member (Dr. El-Beheiry).
- Choosing Wisely Canada, a national voice that promotes reducing unnecessary tests, treatments and procedures granted the RMH lab team and physicians with a Level 1 Designation, reflecting our efforts in providing a tailored approach to testing for each patient.
- 100% funded by donors, we redeveloped our Diagnostic Imaging Department, including the first Robotic Advanced Xray/Fluoroscopy technology in Canada, featuring twin robotic arms that move around the patient, reducing the need for potentially painful movements.
- The RMH Pharmacy successfully met Ontario College of Pharmacists (OCP) accreditation standards, consistently demonstrating excellence in organizational standards since the introduction of provincial-wide pharmacy accreditation in 2016.

• For the third time in a row, RMH was Accredited with Exemplary Standing by Accreditation Canada, having met 99.6% of the required organizational standards.



• Thanks to donors' support, the Hospital's breast health services now include Tomosynthesis (3D imaging that helps to pinpoint the exact size and location of breast lesions) and stereotactic biopsies (a breast biopsy that significantly reduces procedure time, removes less tissue, reduces scarring and major complications, while leading to quicker diagnosis). RMH is the first site in Ontario to use the Smart Curve Breast Stabilization System, which features curved paddles and processing algorithms to ensure a more comfortable experience for our patients.

As we look to 2020, we are excited to continue our development of the City of Kawartha Lakes Ontario Health Team (CKL-OHT). The CKL-OHT will deliver coordinated care and support to patients and families in our region. In its first year, the team will focus on enhancing care and services for seniors, especially those who have had a hospital stay in the last year, and have limited or no community or family supports. Almost every admitted patient at RMH needs an intravenous (IV) pump to deliver medicine, fluids or nutrition. They're needed every minute of every day.
